Dear Mayor DeSana and City Council Members:

First, I would like to thank the Mayor, City Council, and the Wyandotte Department of Public Services for the implementation of the pilot canoe and kayak launch.

An Access to Recreation grant, from the W.K. Kellogg Foundation, has recently become available for Michigan public recreation projects that provide universal accessibility. The winning design will demonstrate how going above and beyond the minimum requirements of the American with Disabilities Act can create greater access and usability for people of all abilities in the community. We are currently partnering with the Wyandotte Recreation Department along with Wilkie and Zanley Architects to create a grant proposal for a universally accessible canoe and kayak launch at Wyandotte's BASF Waterfront Park.

The Access to Recreation grant would provide up to \$250,000 to build a barrier free ramp from Pine Street to the edge of the Detroit River along with additional floating dock sections, Handicap parking, and signage with Braille. These enhancements would make the launch an accessible recreation experience for people of all abilities. Since the current stairs and floating dock were installed it has been used by kayakers from

Wyandotte and local communities, as well as paddlers from outside of the immediate area. The location at BASF Waterfront Park is utilized by paddlers because it affords great opportunities for paddling on the Detroit River, as well as a close location to other amenities.

Since opening Riverside Kayak Connection, at 4016 Biddle Avenue in 2004, we have seen exponential growth of kayaking in the Downriver area. We are currently working with an American Canoe Association instructor with her Adaptive Paddling Endorsement to create kayaking classes for paddlers of all abilities. We have also been in contact with the Wyandotte Department of Education for possible educational programs.

The grant proposal is due by Friday, January 5, 2007 and would require match funds. The necessary match funds would not exceed \$75,000.

This past spring your Honorable Body approved the expenditure of TIFA funds allocated to the Recreation Parks Account for the purchase and installation of a floating dock at BASF Waterfront Park. This dock was to be used as a launching area for kayaks and canoes. The response to and use of this facility was outstanding. I personally received calls from individuals living as far away as Ann Arbor complimenting and thanking the City of Wyandotte for their thoughtfulness in making this launch available.

Last month, I had an opportunity to meet with Tiffany Van de Hey, Riverside Kayak Connection, Anita Twardesky, and Jim Knopp, concerning grant opportunities for the possible enhancement of the kayak launching facility at BASF Park.

Ms. Twardesky, who is now working for Ms. Van de Hey, is a former recreation director in Flat Rock and Woodhaven. She is a successful grant writer and very familiar with grants that may be available for this type of project. The proposed project would include enhancements to the current kayak launch ramp, make the facility handicap accessible, and provide other amenities that will improve the aesthetics in the area surrounding the launch facility.

This letter is to request your support of the grant application for this project which would require \$75,000 in matching funds from the City. If the application is approved, \$250,000 would come from the State of

Michigan to complete the project. I am recommending that the \$75,000 match come from the unfunded balance of the Consolidated TWA district. If the Council still wishes to address the other issues concerning Judges, Constables, deletion of the term freeholder and changing it to resident and modifying the date of election, it would be necessary for four (4) additional ballot questions to be prepared on those separate issues. If the Council decides to proceed with the previous Resolution concerning the change of the Treasurer's office from elective to appointive, a decision still has to be made on the date of the election.

The City of Wyandotte Engineering and Building Department solicited a proposal from Soil and Materials Engineers, Inc (SME) to provide the following services:

Field locate the borings;  
Drill five borings, each extending 20 feet below the ground surface;  
Perform laboratory tests on recovered samples; and,  
Summarize our findings and analysis in a report.

Based on the information gathered from the soil borings SME will provide the following recommendations:

Seismic Site Class based on site borings;  
Site preparations and earthwork recommendations, including site subgrade preparation, compaction material requirements for engineered fill;  
Subgrade preparation for slabs on grade; and,  
Regarding design of foundations to support the proposed building.

SME has submitted a cost to provide these services for \$3,500.00.

If the above proposal meets with Council's approval, the undersigned recommends that Council authorize the undersigned to execute the necessary documents to perform the work.

FINAL READING OF AN ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CITY OF WYANDOTTE  
ZONING ORDINANCE BY AMENDING  
ARTICLE XVIII. GENERAL PROVISIONS  
SECTION 1808 Performance Standards  
Sub-Section 18-8.5 Noise

CITY OF WYANDOTTE ORDAINS:

Section 1. Amendment.

The following Section of the City of Wyandotte Zoning Ordinance entitled Article XVIII. General Provisions, Section 1808 Performance Standards shall be amended to read as follows:

Add Section 1808.5 Noise:

a. Levels of noise shall be controlled in accord with the City of Wyandotte Code of Ordinances, Article IV Offenses Against Public Peace.

b. Noise from any use of property shall not exceed 55 DBA as measured at the property line of the use emitting such noise. Exceeding this level shall constitute prima facie evidence that such noise unreasonably disturbs the comfort, quiet and repose of persons in the area. The "DBA" represents the sound pressure level in decibels measured on the "A" scale of a standard level meter. Temporary uses such as lawn mowers, snow blower and portable generators are excepted provided such uses does not exceed one (1) hours per twenty-four (24) hours. Portable generators may be utilized for the entire period of a power outage.

Section 2. Interpretation.

Nothing in this Ordinance or in the Code hereby adopted shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding in any court, or any rights acquired, or liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing, under any act or ordinance hereby repealed; nor shall any just or legal right or remedy or any character be lost, impaired or affected by this Ordinance.

Section 3. Severability.

Severability. Should any word, sentence, phrase or any portion of this Ordinance be held in a manner invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction or by any state agency having authority to do so for any reason whatsoever, such holdings shall be construed and limited to such word, sentence, phrase or any portion of the Ordinance held to be so invalid and shall not be construed as affecting the validity of any of the remaining words, sentences, phrases or portions of this Ordinance.

Section 4. Repeal of Conflicting Ordinances.

Conflicting Ordinances. All prior existing ordinances adopted by the City of Wyandotte inconsistent or in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency, hereby expressly repealed.

Section 5. Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall take effect fifteen (15) days from the date of its passage by the Wyandotte City Council and shall be published in a newspaper generally circulated in the City of Wyandotte within ten (10)

days after adoption.
