Honorable Mayor and Council:

The Seaway Boat Club of Wyandotte is requesting the closing of approximately 100' of the city road (Perry Place) that abuts our property and BASF for our annual dock party on August 08 through August 10, 2008.

The purpose of our request is to erect a 40' x 60' tent to provide shelter for our party. None of the other property owners on Perry Place will be affected by this closure. As in the past we will obtain a special permit from the L.C.C. to dispense alcoholic beverages outside of our licensed premises. The 100' area will be enclosed by portable fencing and access controlled by us in the requirements of the L.C.C. which controls the issue of special permits for this type of activity.

Seaway Boat Club agrees to sign all papers required by the City, including a hold harmless agreement releasing the City of all liability. It is also further understood that we will not drill or anchor said tent to the concrete roadway, which could result in damage to the road surface. Access at all times during these three days will be made available for police and emergency vehicles. The tent will be installed on Thursday, August 7th and removed on Monday, August 11, 2008.

Dear Mayor DeSana and Council Members:

The 27th District Court has researched the need for an x-ray machine for the new Police & Court building. As part of their research, the District Courts in Southgate, Allen Park, Taylor and Livonia were contacted along with various vendors.

SecurMAR was selected as the best x-ray screening system. This equipment also has the added benefit of being Department of Homeland Security certified. This x-ray system in conjunction with the current metal detector will provide a system that will detect guns, explosive materials and narcotics at the public entrance location at the new building. SecurMAR has submitted a quote of \$29,337.00 for a Hi-Scan 6030di x-ray system. There is a one year warranty period with an optional cost of \$15,300.00 for a five year on-site maintenance service agreement, which is payable with the initial payment. Therefore, the total cost is 44,637.00.

If City employees are utilized as operators of the x-ray screening system, then they should also attend a one day training class; this class can be attended by up to ten (10) people at the Police/Court Building. After the class the operators will be certified in the operation of the x-ray machine. The cost of the one day training class is \$3,500.00. If the City contracts for this service, then the cost of training would not be required.

The undersigned recommends acceptance of the quote from SecurMar, Crown Point, Indiana, in the amount of \$44,637.00 plus an option for \$3,500.00 for the training, subject to the submittal of a Certificate of Liability Insurance naming the City of Wyandotte as an additional named insured. Payment will be a lump sum payment upon final acceptance of the work provided, and the work will be funded from the Police and Court Account No. 400-301-825-340.

It should be noted that there is not currently any budget allotted for court or police personnel to be stationed at the equipment once it is installed at the new Police & Court facility. Therefore, the purchase of this equipment implies that funding will be provided in next year's budget and annually there after.

Dear Mr. Griggs,

Ground transportation companies are being hard hit with increases to their fuel costs. In Southeastern Michigan, gas prices at most of the service stations have recently jumped to almost \$4.00 per gallon. Forecasters claim that fuel cost may even soar higher in the upcoming months. Please review the recent fuel rate history that I have attached to this letter.

All of our vendors, have added fuel surcharges, and/or increased prices due to the rising cost of fuel.

This creates an extreme hardship for Trinity, Inc; DBA Downriver and Wyandotte Cab Company. With the high cost of operating taxicabs, Downriver and Wyandotte Cab Company has found it necessary to request from each downriver community and increase in our taxi rates to \$3.00 pickup fee and \$2.50 per mile, effective immediately. We may need to request additional increases in the future if fuel costs continue to sky rocket.

History acknowledges that within the past several years, cab fares have remained constant even though costs have sky-rocketed. With this in mind, it is necessary for Downriver Cab to increase our rates as noted above.

WHEREAS, The City's retiree health care is currently funded on a pay-as-you go basis, creating an unfunded liability for post-retirement health care; and WHEREAS, The City's actuaries, Gabriel Roeder Smith & Company, have identified several strategies for addressing the unfunded liability; and WHEREAS, The Mayor and City Council wish to address this unfunded liability in a prudent manner; and WHEREAS, Act Number 149 of the Public Acts of 1999 of the State of Michigan, effective November 1, 1999, provides for the creation by public corporations of public employee health care funds and their administration; WHEREAS, The City of Wyandotte desires to create a public employee health care fund to be used for the accumulation and investment of monies for the purpose of funding health care for the City of Wyandotte retirees and their beneficiaries, as provided for in Public Act 149 of 1999; and NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED That the City of Wyandotte City Council hereby establish the Post Retirement Health Care Fund (Fund) as provided for in Public Act 149 of 1999, to be used for the accumulation and investment of monies for the purpose of funding health care for City of Wyandotte retirees and their beneficiaries who are designated as "qualified persons" by

the City of Wyandotte; withdrawals from the Fund shall be used solely for the payment of health care benefits on behalf of "qualified persons" and for the payment of expenses of administering the Fund. "Qualified Person" are City of Wyandotte retirees and their beneficiaries who are eligible to receive health care benefits under an employment agreement or as otherwise provided to retirees and their beneficiaries of the City of Wyandotte; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That the Commission members of the City of Wyandotte Retirement System be designated as the Fund's investment fiduciary; that the investment fiduciary invest the assets of the Fund in accordance with the Public Employee Retirement System Investment Act; that the investment fiduciary have an actuarial review of the Fund prepared at least every five (5) years with assets valued on a market related basis; that the Fund shall be established on an actuarial basis; that the investment fiduciary prepare and issue a summary annual report to the City Council; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That unless and until the investment fiduciary resolves otherwise, the current officers, vendors, professionals and other service providers of the City of Wyandotte Retirement System, except the medical director and money managers, shall hold the corresponding positions with the Post Retirement Health Care Fund on the same basis and with the same duties, responsibilities, and compensation as with the Retirement System, any compensation therefore to be paid from the income of the Post Retirement Health Care Fund; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that continued funding of the Fund be accomplished through decisions of the City Council; that withdrawals from the Fund be solely for the payment of health care, benefits on behalf of qualified persons and the payment of the expenses of administration of the Fund.
