With the spirit of the above two quotes in mind, it is our City Authority's responsibility to re-evaluate how ordinances, such as the recent passage of the "extremely restrictive massage regulation," can "expand our minds". Review the definition of "government micromangement" and the effects on the economy of Michigan. The current massage ordinance restricts the massage arena, the locksmith service, non-massage businesses, non-profit organizations. And tests the entire service community...what can be done to one, can be done to many. Failure to enforce the quality of service is, likely, due to restriction of competition, regardless of whether or not ordinances are adhered to.

The following proposed incentives are for purposes of providing economical hope and encouragement to residents and businesses:

1. Entities (persons) interested in helping can be further directed/informed at the City Hall, the Library and entities such as local business associations that are open to helping our community create opportunity.
2. A city approved packet delivered door to door (or various innovative means) that summarizes the City of Wyandotte Stimulus Summer Package authorization.
3. "Recycled Art" and "Ice Cream" contest events in a spirit of competition.
4. Summer "bicycle show" to promote exercise, safety and gas savings in response to current situation. Bicycle teams and buffs, hopefully would welcome this opportunity in a City park lacking events. All persons attending are responsible for area condition, including cost of waste disposal. Promote city bike licenses.
5. Free garage sales from July 17, 2008 to August 17, 2008. Promote recycling at garage sales with Wayne Co. DOE resource recovery guide at sign up time.
6. Permit vendor chair massage by licensed Detroit/Downriver Massage Therapists and residential massage by Wyandotte licensed massage therapists as a future prototype.
7. Vendor opportunities in designated (minimum of 5) public areas such as parks and parking lots, from July 17, 2008 to August 17, 2008. (Conveniences such as utilities and sewage are the discretion of authorities) Cleanup: responsibility of vendors and participants, including cost of waste disposal. Vendor service/products require City approval; used goods in good taste ok. Vendor advantage: City business or resident as of June 12, 2008 (40%); Detroit/Downriver (bus or res) as of June 12, 2008 (30%); Michigan (bus or res) as of June 12, 2008 (20%); USA legal (bus or res) as of June 12, 2008 (10%). (No offense to

foreign nations, we strive to pay our debts)

8. Other ideas welcome as of June 19, 2008, forwarded to Council and Mayor of the City of Wyandotte, Michigan.

Vendor businesses are emphasized to help folks have a means to pay expected taxes and bills. Pondering of these ideas in a "can do" fashion will provide opportunity. Businesses (small and large) and organizations have a way of making good things happen for the good of all, when provided a welcome hope to do so.

Dear Mayor and Council,

We are writing you concerning a recent bid made for a vacant lot at Vinewood and P.

On February 6th, 2008 we wrote a letter to Mayor and Council expressing our desire to build a single story, handicap accessible home in Wyandotte, but also concern that the available lots in the downtown area were always slated for two-story homes. We also noted that the lot at Vinewood and 3<sup>rd</sup> was our first choice, as that gave my husband access to the downtown community via a scooter.

While we received no reply to that letter, on March 19, 2008, we received a phone call from Kelly in the building department indicating that the Vinewood lot we were interested in had again become available, and that she had been asked to call to let us know we could pursue purchasing it. We immediately picked up a bid packet, and in doing so, discussed with Kelly our intentions to build a handicap accessible single-story home, square footage requirements for the lot size, and also indicated to her that we had no idea what to bid as we had never been involved in this process before. Kelly stated that the City would take a minimum of \$5000 for that lot, but in filling out the application, we noticed that our paperwork stated the minimum bids accepted were only \$1000. We felt comfortable in what Kelly had told us and figured offering five times the minimum stated in writing simply showed good faith. We returned the packet to the Building Dept. that same day. Kelly then told us that we would not hear for 45 days as they had just sent the previous owner a letter allowing him that long to commit to building. Shortly thereafter, and long before the 45 days were up, we were made aware that the owner had petitioned Council and received his deposit back. We also became aware that the City had passed a \$10,000 minimum bid resolution, but as ours had already been turned in, felt that did not pertain to us. Around 60 days after turning in our application, we called Kelly to see why we hadn't heard anything, and was told that it would be "in the next week or two;" then that date passed. We tried calling the City Engineer, as Kelly mentioned that he is who made the decision for the committee to meet, and left three messages; but all requests to return our phone calls went unanswered. On Thursday, May 15, Kelly called and stated that they would be looking at our application early in the next week as they had another bid come in to look at as well, but not for our lot. Today we received a call from her indicating that our bid was opened and turned down because the City only wants a two-story Victorian with a wrap-around porch built on that lot, and our bid was too low!

We are asking the Committee, as well as the Mayor and Council, to reconsider our application based on the following: The City called US and led us to believe that the lot at Vinewood and 3<sup>rd</sup> was available to build a single-story, handicap accessible home. The minimum bid stated by a Building Department liaison was \$5000 for this lot, although the paperwork we were given states an even lower minimum bid of \$1000, and no one else has bid on this lot. Kelly also cited a reason for being turned down is that there are only two-story homes in the area so a ranch would not fit in; but there is a ranch directly across the street on 3<sup>rd</sup>, and more in the immediate area, including the 100 block of Vinewood. We exceeded the minimum square footage Kelly stated would be allowed, and presented a Victorian façade option with extras, such as a double gabled roof with dimensional shingles, and stone accents so that this home would fit into the existing neighborhood. The home plan itself was described by our builder, Bill Dalquist (whom you trusted and approved to build other units in the nearby neighborhood) as being "perfect" for the surrounding existing home styles.

In reading the material that accompanied our application packet, we noted the "suggested" minimum requirements for building either a one or two-story home in Wyandotte. We also observed, based on looking at homes that are so new they are still empty, that the City does, and has, allowed some to be built that do not meet those requirements. We are asking that you allow us that same opportunity and reconsider our proposal to build the submitted handicap accessible home on the lot at Vinewood and 3<sup>rd</sup>. We would also like to point out that the desired home, a two-story Victorian with a wrap-around porch, is exactly what the original builder could not find a buyer for! I would hope that in these times, and under the circumstances outlined above, that the City would see the benefit of allowing someone who is willing to build, but has special needs, to be granted the opportunity to do so.

We believe we met and exceeded every requirement stated, both verbally and in writing, that was given us

at the time of our application; and stating a new minimum bid now as part of the reason for our denial should not apply due to the date of our submission. We also feel that the City offered us the opportunity to respond to the phone call made to us knowing fully what our building needs were, both in writing (in a previous letter submitted to Council) and in conversation with the Building Department before submission, and have now wasted over two months of our time if their intentions all along were to stick to their original architectural guidelines.

We hope that perhaps the "committee" was simply not aware of the circumstances surrounding this situation, and will agree that we should be granted the opportunity to build our required home design on the lot at Vinewood and 3rd. We look forward to hearing from you in the near future so that building can begin and no further time is wasted.

Attached for your review and approval is a Lease Agreement relative to golf carts at Wyandotte Shores Golf Course. Per the City Council Resolution dated June 2, 2008, the undersigned was referred the response from the General Manager of Municipal Services relative to the Plante & Moran Management Letter for a review and report back to Mayor and Council. Members of the Municipal Service Finance Subcommittee and administrative employees from the City and the Department of Municipal Services, along with representatives from Plante and Moran, met on four (4) occasions between October of 2007 and January of 2008 to discuss changes in the administrative structure of the City. These changes were focused on creating efficiencies between the City and DMS staff, reallocating workload to allow employees to perform high level financial analysis and assistance to department heads, and allowing for greater segregation of duties amongst financial personnel. The consensus was that these changes would lead to better service, the dissemination of more timely information, minimization of risk, and better use of resources through the reallocation of existing spending.

As a result of these meetings, the attached Organizational Chart for a consolidated Administrative Services Department that would service both the City and DMS was developed. The timing for this reorganization was tentatively scheduled to be completed by September 30, 2008 with the changes phased in during the beginning of 2008. Per the recent correspondence from Melanie McCoy, General Manager of DMS, it appears that the completion date has not changed but the implementation will occur entirely in the last quarter of the 2008 Fiscal Year.

In addition, it appears that Ms. McCoy is also implementing changes in staffing to both the Cable and Electric Departments.

In summary, the City is prepared to implement the proposed changes to the Administrative Service Department as outlined in the proposed organization chart as quickly as the appropriate changes can be made by the Department of Municipal Services.

Dear Mayor DeSana and City Council Members,

The Wayne County Board of Public Works has submitted the sewage disposal rates effective July 1, 2008, for approval by the Wayne County Commission. The proposed rates represent an increase of 3.38% from the prior year's rate.

In order to meet current City obligations, the following sewage rate per million gallons is being recommended:

Operation and Maintenance \$1,484.43  
Debt Service 502.42  
Replacement 255.85  
Meter Loss 138.80  
Collection Cost 50.50  
Total \$2,432.00

The proposed sewage rate includes an 8.00% rate increase over the current sewage rate of \$2,252.00/million gallons. The rate increase is primarily necessitated by increased debt service requirements relating to the approved capital improvement projects at the treatment facility. The total estimated to increase in the sewage rate is 41.39% over the next five (5) years. Note that the Sewage Disposal Fund does not receive any subsidy from other City funds for infrastructure improvements. Including this proposed rate increase, the average annual rate increase since 1997 is 4.80%.

Please note on Attachment B that the increase in sewage rate is estimated to cost the average homeowner \$2.46 per month or \$29.47 per year. The proposed sewage rate would continue to place the City of Wyandotte as the second lowest sewage rate out of the thirteen communities that utilize the Wyandotte Wastewater Treatment Plant (Attachment C). Also, enclosed on Attachment D is the conversion calculation from million cubic feet to million gallons.
