Honorable Mayor and Council,

I come before you today to pay off the Special Assessment levied against my property at 3366 Biddle. The project completed in 2003 had an estimated cost of \$30,362.63 the actual cost came in at \$39,417.85 and at that time the council voted the actual cost could be no more than 15% of the estimate that made the balance due was \$34,917.02 for the replacement of 230 feet of sidewalk with sidewalk, lights, and pavers. At the time I was a member of the DDA and thought it would be a project they should pay for as in other communities but failed due to lack of support. We did however decide to give the property owners a break and not charge interest on the 20 year obligation assessed.

I was under the impression the \$34,917.02 would be paid over 20 years in yearly installments. When the bill came in the first year I told Ruthanne to let it roll on to the taxes and at least it might be deductible.

After that it was never mentioned. I happen to be opening my 14,042.58 tax bill and saw the \$2,797.64 assessment thinking that seemed like a lot I started my education.

I found out from the assessors office how much I had paid so far (\$17,018.26) and that there was in fact interest being paid but that the approximate interest of the loan \$12,507.28 was subtracted making the total due \$22,409.75 but with 6% annual interest with the idea that if the property owner paid over 20 years they would pay the \$34,917.02 the cost before the interest deduction of \$12,507.28. Next stop the engineering dept and Greg Meyring for the cost breakdown of the project and find out if there was a grant for the lights which I am supposed to receive Wed 8/19. Now I moved on to finance and Todd I told him I did an amortization schedule and the payoff amount did not match. If you amortize \$22,409.75 over 20 years the total paid would be \$39,466.37 which is more than the actual cost the council voted not to impose.

As I understand it goal is to recover the cost of \$34,917.02 if you use \$20,025.00 over 20 years @ 6% the recovery would come to \$34,917.42 a lot closer to the intent. Using that logic of the \$17,018.26 paid so far (\$10,340.19 P \$6,678.07 I) I would owe \$9,684.81 which I am prepared to pay. This would bring the total I have paid for an obligation I did not sign one document for to \$26,703.07 over a 6 year period.

I reviewed the work sheet from the city and found \$1391.80 in penalties when I inquired I was informed it is in the charter and legal. Well I have never read the charter but I have borrowed money and always had disclosure and a complete understanding of the obligation I sought. In this case even members of the DDA did not understand the terms of the debt. Everyone I have contacted Assessors, Engineering, and Finance have been helpful in my research and I thank them for that. In addition to the \$14,042.58 in property tax I would like to end all debt associated with my Special Assessment before September when more interest is scheduled. In this terrible business climate and unsure future I will pay the city \$9,684.81 before September for a final payment on SAD 845 Wyandotte Restaurants

Honorable Mayor and City Council Members;

As you are aware, the Wyandotte Museums Ford-MacNichol Home is in the midst of an extensive exterior restoration. The phase to begin in 08 and carry on into 09 is the painting and wood replacement of the facade.

Funding in the amount of \$65,322 for this project has been secured in the 08 FY. With the approved bid of \$123,515.00, we have been withholding beginning work this summer until the total amount of resources were secured, as requested. This was to be carried out via 09 FY requests approved by the DDA to cover the remaining \$58,193 (see attached documentation).

The DDA Oversight subcommittee met August 14th, and are recommending inclusion of the expenditures for this project to the DDA for the 2009 fiscal year budget, which will meet in full again September 8th.

Given these circumstances and that the conditions of the earlier attached resolution has been fulfilled, please consider approving initiation of the contract process with the chosen contractor.

Last year, the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society of Michigan moved their annual evening walk from the Riverview area (Young Patriots Park) to Wyandotte. It was a major success with many supporters being residents and/or consumers within our community. This event is described by the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society staff below –

The Leukemia and Lymphoma Society hosts an awareness event each fall season in the Downriver Community called "Light the Night". With the increased prevalence of blood cancers in the downriver area, this event is well attended each year (rain or shine). Considered a family evening event, it is free to the public-while we ask participants to raise money for our cause, since it is an awareness event there is no set donation requirement. Our food, entertainment, etc. are all donated by local sponsors. The Downriver Light the Night Walk typically hosts between 200-250 people, with clowns, face painting, a tribute to our survivors and a short (1-3 mile) walk. Dear Mayor DeSana and Council Members —

In accordance with the provisions of Michigan Public Act # 200 of 1969, I would like to request that the Department of Public Works please close Biddle Avenue from 8:00 AM to Noon to hold the 65th Annual Wyandotte Christmas Parade Saturday, November 22, 2008. This parade has been traditionally scheduled on the third Saturday in November each year.

The parade will necessitate closing Biddle Avenue from Ford Street to Plum Street. Northbound traffic would be rerouted to Third Street and to Ford Avenue and Southbound traffic will be rerouted from Ford Avenue to Fourth Street during that period.

The Chief of Police is requested to apply to the Wayne County Office of Public Service for a road closure permit. He should be designated with the authority to sign the street closing permit documentation on behalf of the City of Wyandotte.
