This letter acknowledges receipt of a report dated August 27, 2009 from Mr. Mark Kowalewski, P.E., Wyandotte City Engineer, regarding the Preliminary copies of the Flood Insurance Study (FIS) report and Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) for Wayne County, MI. Mr. Kowalewski submitted an updated Detroit River Statistical Analysis, which was performed by Applied Science, Inc. on behalf of the City of Wyandotte. Because the report commented on the elevations of the flood having a 1-percent chance of being equaled or exceeded in any given year (base flood) shown on the Preliminary FIRM, it was reviewed as an appeal in accordance with the provisions of Title 44, Chapter I, Part 67, Code of Federal Regulations.

We have evaluated the submitted report and accepted the appeal. The flood hazards have been revised as shown in the enclosed revised Preliminary FIRM panels and Flood Profiles. The flood hazard will be depicted on the final flood maps for Wayne County, Michigan (All Jurisdictions). The new flood hazard delineation has a significant impact upon the Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA), or the 1-percent annual chance flood hazard, the 0.2-percent annual chance flood hazard and BFEs along Detroit River.

Because the updated hydrologic and hydraulic computations result in revised flood hazard boundaries and revised BFEs that impact areas outside of the City of Wyandotte, coordination between FEMA, the mapping contractor (Stantec Consulting Services, Inc) and the following communities has taken place during the appeal process:

These communities are receiving copies of this letter and are requested to provide written concurrence with the study results during the 30-day comment period for appeal resolution. If concurrence is not received from both the communities listed above, a new 90-day appeal period will be opened to provide these communities the opportunity to appeal the revised BFEs by submitting technical data. Such an appeal period would further delay the effective date for the new countywide flood maps in Wayne County.
