RE: Bid Procedure for Solid Waste Collection

Dear Mayor and City Council:

The following state law is controlling in our fact situation concerning the bid procedure for solid waste collection. MCL 324.11903 reads in part as follows:

"A municipality may enter into a contract with a person or municipality, providing for the acquisition, construction, financing, and operation of a waste management project or for the use of the services of a project. Notwithstanding the requirements of its municipal charter or ordinances, the municipality, following the receipt from persons of bids or proposals for a contract referred to in this section, may negotiate with 1 or more persons who have submitted the bids or proposals, permit those persons to modify their bids or proposals, and enter into a contract with 1 or more of those persons on the basis of a bid or proposal as modified."

Based upon the above it is my opinion that the City is in compliance with the state law requirements with regards to the bid procedure. Also, court decisions have held that when the bid specifications permits the City to reject any and all bids, the City in its discretion may reject a lower bid for a higher one if the City determines it is in the City's best interest.

Michigan case law is clear that the bid procedure is designed to protect the public and not the contractors who submit a successful bid.

The 50th Annual Wyandotte Street Art Fair will be held on July 13-16, 2011. This letter is sent to request that the Public Works Department be notified to close Biddle Avenue, from Oak to Eureka, for the 2011 Wyandotte Street Art Fair from Sunday, July 10, starting at 12:01 AM through Monday, July 18, 8 AM. North and southbound traffic will be rerouted on Third Street with detours at Oak Street and Eureka, all truck traffic to be rerouted to M-85 (Fort Street) via Eureka or Ford (Northline).

The Chief of Police is requested to apply to the Wayne County Office of Public Service for a road closing permit; he should be designated and authorized to sign said street closing permit document on behalf of the City of Wyandotte. Responsibility for all damage claims which may arise from the road closing must be assumed by the City of Wyandotte. The Fire Department should also be notified of this event to reroute emergency vehicles.

Also, the Wyandotte Street Art Fair would like to request the following:

1. Permission to allow the city sidewalks listed below to be used during the Art Fair only, July 13-16, and by those merchants who are issued permits from the Art Fair Committee:

Biddle Avenue, Eureka to Chestnut Street
Oak Street, Van Alstyne to Third Street
Elm Street, Van Alstyne to Third Street
Maple Street, Van Alstyne to Third Street
Sycamore Street, Van Alstyne to Third Street
Eureka Road, Van Alstyne to Third Street
First Street, Oak to Maple

Further, this permission should extend only to those merchants who have been issued a permit. They are not authorized to sub-contract their space. Enforcement of this policy should be authorized by the Wyandotte Police Department under Ordinance 32-1.

2. Permission for the use of First Street from Elm to Maple Street for the display and sale of handmade craft items as approved by the Wyandotte Street Art Fair Committee/Staff.

3. Permission to utilize the Parking Lot # 10 on First Street for crafter parking.

4. Permission for the Wyandotte Business Association to be allowed to have paid parking in parking lot #11 and #9 (the east side 30 parking spaces on Maple and Second Street) from July 11 through July 18 funds from this lot are to return to the Wyandotte Business Association as approved by the Wyandotte Street Art Fair Committee.

5. The Wyandotte Street Art Fair Committee request that outdoor sale and drinking of all alcoholic beverages be done by licensed vendors which have been authorized by the Art Fair Committee. Enforcement of this policy should be authorized by the Wyandotte Police Department under Ordinance 25-9. It is to be prohibited for any person to bring in their own alcoholic beverages at the Wyandotte Street Art Fair.

6. Permission to utilize the Chase Bank Building Parking Lot, area closest to Third Street, July 12 through July 18, as a parking lot for with a charge for the benefit of the Wyandotte Goodfellows and Old Time Ballplayers.

7. Permission to utilize the waterfront parking lot #1, grassy area, and adjacent between Elm and Oak, for entertainment and refreshment area.

8. Permission to utilize Biddle Avenue, from Eureka to Plum Street, to be utilized as a designated parking area, under the control of the Wyandotte Boat Club, subject to approval and coordination of the Department of Legal Affairs, Engineering Dept. and Police Department.

9. Permission to utilize the open area between Sandy's Shoppe and Frank's Pizzeria, July 11 through July 18, for the Wyandotte Street Art Fair.

Dear Mayor Peterson and Council Members;

On September 15, 2010, during excavation for sewer repair in the alley between Mulberry and Walnut, east of 4th Street, the City's contractor began excavating soil of questionable nature. The soil has a strong scent of gasoline or oil and was discolored. In order to properly determine disposal procedures for this soil, analysis is required.

The Department of Engineering contacted Soil and Materials Engineers, Inc, (SME) of Plymouth, MI, to discuss proper testing and reporting procedures to properly handle this soil. SME has current contracts with the City for environmental consulting services. SME has proposed to perform environmental consulting services for the analysis and disposal of this soil in the amount \$4,000.00, per the attached Proposal.

The undersigned recommends that Council authorize the Engineering Department to accept the attached Proposal from SME to perform the environmental services as described. This cost will be paid from the Sewer Fund Account #590-200-926.310.
