I am writing you to inform you on some of the recent happenings at the Downriver Council for the Arts, which is located in the Wyandotte Arts Center at 81 Chestnut.

As you are aware, I began as Director only a few months prior to camp enrollment and despite our late start, our four Summer Youth Art Camps proved to be a success. The children involved had a wonderful time at the camp and are looking forward to re-enrollment in 2012. Although we consolidated camps due to low enrollment this year, 2012 will provide us with the opportunity to aggressively market these programs early in the year.

The Downriver Council for the Arts just celebrated the first annual Arts and Honors program. This event has replaced our Salute to Excellence program. The former event was ticketed and greatly limited the number of attendees. Arts and Honors was a free of charge event that celebrated the arts in the downriver area. This enabled more people to appreciate and see what great artist and performers we have. The event attendance increased from previous years and we anticipate growth in the upcoming years. Keith Coleman was awarded Artist/ Performer of the year. Lara Semetko was awarded young artist of the year. Ken Wojjak was awarded Art Educator of the year. And Oakwood Health System was awarded Patron of the year with their work with the arts. Our Founder's Society was awarded the Downriver Council for the Arts Award. AKT Project performed, as well as the East River Folk Society, and The Glee inspired DYPAC JAZ. The event was a great expression on the Arts.

We have many programs planned for the month of October. We will be hosting a pumpkin carving evening in the beginning of October. The community will be able to come to the WAC and carve pumpkins we will then judge the pumpkins and will have them on display. We are also offering a fundraiser event for the Downriver Council for the Arts on Saturday, October 8, 2011. Our Monster Mash Bash will offer many different activities throughout the building. We will have a glow-in-the-dark exhibit, as well as food and beverages, the Wyandotte Community Theatre will present a 10 minute preview of their show Neighborhood 3 and we will also have dancing and Scarey-oke. This will be a ticketed event and tickets are available by calling the Downriver Council for the Arts at 734-720-0671 or on our website at www.downriverarts.org

We are also excited to announce that the Downriver Council for the Arts and musician Rob Bourassa are collaborating on new classes, workshops and concerts. All of these events will be held at the Wyandotte Arts Center. We will update the mayor and the council about upcoming events.

We have also enclosed our new marketing piece. "Mark your calendars" This is a piece that we will continue to produce. It gives the community a snapshot of what is coming up in the months at the Downriver Council for the Arts. We have taken the liberty of adding Mayor Peterson and Council to our regular mailing list and coordinating our event listings with the City website, calendar and electronic signage.

Lastly, I am working with the Downtown Development Authority Director and the Museums Director on the following collaborative projects and marketing our events for 2012: The DIA Inside Out Project from April to June of 2012 and several of the Heritage Event Series events for the 2012 Calendar year.

Dear Mayor and City Council,

I am requesting approval for my landscaping rocks that have been on the edge of my property and next to the curb for several years. They have provided protection for the grass area in front of my house against cars driving on the grass. Prior to the rocks I had huge ruts and dead grass on the sides by the street due to cars driving off the cement. But since the rock were installed the grass looks great. And since I am charged with the maintenance of the city right of way, it should be my choice as to protect my grass or keep filling in ruts and hope the grass seed will take before another car runs it over again.

The complaint about the rocks came from the owner of 1087 16th Street (next door).

This complaint is a part of a long list of harassment perpetrated by that neighbor. This is well documented and detective Yoscovitz can also verify. This evidence can be provided if needed. She also knew about my rocks prior to purchasing the house next door last year. I can also provide evidence as to the ease in which her and others come in and out of her drive-way without any incumbrance. This complaint is not a valid complaint on her part. I will have available a petition signed by other neighbors who want the rock to stay where it is.

I had 2 smaller sized rocks until someone (I believe it to be my next door neighbor) stole only the one by her property. So I had replaced it with a rock larger so as it cannot be stolen so easily. I had planned to replace the other smaller one with a larger one so as to even them out. But now I will wait for your approval.

Included with this letter is a copy of the complaint and a current petition to keep the rocks where they are. There are not many signatures yet because various work times of neighbors. But I will have many more by the time this letter is voted on.
